A recent analysis of departmental business objectives concluded that the allocation of IT resources could be better managed by introduction of a governance structure to address enterprise IT needs. The construct of an IT governance framework facilitates the implementation of the department's strategic objectives by prioritizing project proposals, and by authorizing the resources to support them. Governance structure is a key mechanism in transforming the IT function and will result in the following:

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- -improved access to IT resources across organizational boundaries
- -better allocation of IT resources and management of risk to appropriate levels

The role of the Portfolio Project Management Office is central to the development, implementation, and modifications that accompany enterprise-level applications. The PPMO will be on the front-line of assessing and evaluating organizational business needs in order to identify the most effective IT solutions. It will also be instrumental in deciding which projects are green-lighted and which are deferred. In addition, it will work closely with division staff to develop solutions that meet prescribed needs and ensure successful implementation. As a result, this request seeks the transfer of existing IT FTEs from the Divisions of Agricultural Law Enforcement, Licensing, and Food, Nutrition and Wellness to staff the PPMO office within OATS.

These positions can be moved from their existing divisions with little impact and the move will not require any statutory changes or rule suspensions to achieve. In addition, moving unfunded salary rate and authority from the Division of Plant Industry will also have little effect. The Plant Industry Trust Fund currently has salary and benefit authority in excess of funding, which has resulted in reversions.

The current IT organizational structure and decision-making framework has resulted in a splintered environment with respect to the IT workforce and underlying support. The IT function is largely decentralized and concentrated among a handful of divisions that operate independently, based on individual needs and resources. Moving these positions to OATS will help the Department adopt more enterprise wide IT solutions and eliminate duplicative efforts currently being performed by division staff.

#### ADVERSE IMPACT IF NOT FUNDED:

The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services has largely operated as a collection of independent programs with unique and specific objectives. Each program or division is separately funded and conducts its activities with minimal consideration of other program areas. There is little if any coordinated effort for implementing new technologies or establishing standards for methodologies and solutions.

Without a team of qualified IT professionals experienced in project management and application development, capable of

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guiding the direction and progress of enterprise-level projects, it is unrealistic that a true cooperative effort can be engineered across the many programs of the organization. And without an authentic attempt to collaboratively achieve solutions for IT needs, such efforts are likely to fall short of expectations, and the department will almost certainly forego any possibility of cost savings through efficiencies over the use of current systems and processes.

#### DESCRIPTION OF ISSUE:

This issue seeks the transfer of \$26,870 of OPS and \$120 of Human Resources Special Category authority from the Division of Fruit and Vegetables Citrus Inspection Trust Fund to the Division of Food Safety General Revenue Fund. This authority will be used to fund one OPS position within the Bureau of Dairy Industry.

The Bureau of Dairy Industry within the Division of Food Safety is responsible for ensuring that dairy products purchased by Florida consumers are wholesome, produced under sanitary conditions and correctly labeled. The bureau regulates the production, transporting, processing, distribution and labeling of milk and milk products. It also establishes standards for these products, whether they originate in Florida or other states. The bureau carries out these responsibilities with a staff of 22 full time positions. This request seeks funding for one OPS position within the Bureau of Dairy Industry to assist full time staff in the posting of data into the dairy inspection and sampling database as well as handling calls, filing and running reports from the database for Federal staff, state inspectors and rating officers. In addition, this OPS position would also assist in the typing of warning letters regarding product standards and repeat violations, and the processing of bureau travel and regular expenditures as needed.

department collected in excess of \$140 million in checks, coupons and remote payments in Fiscal Year 2012-13. The revenue is collected at different locations throughout the state. To improve our operational efficiencies, we plan to consolidate our collection sites. In addition, reconciliation of revenues to the number of licenses or permits issued is not being conducted at the division level. Professional accountants within the Division of Administration are responsible for recording journal transfers, credit card payments, ACH/wires, revenue corrections and accounts receivable and performing revenue analyses and reconciliations. Due to the amount of time these professional accountants currently spend on the manual check process, their other duties become back logged. The Division of Fruit and Vegetables can transfer three maintenance FTEs with little impact and the move will not require any statutory changes or rule suspensions to achieve. During the 2013 Legislative Session, the Department received approval to purchase a new building for the Division of Fruit and Vegetables. This new building will replace a much larger and much older building that is currently used to house staff from the Division of Fruit and Vegetables. As a result, the maintenance needs for the Division are expected to be greatly reduced.

In addition, moving unfunded salary rate and authority from the Division of Plant Industry will also have little effect. The Plant Industry Trust Fund currently has salary and benefit authority in excess of funding, which has resulted in reversions.

#### ADVERSE IMPACT IF NOT FUNDED:

The operational efficiencies associated with centralized revenue collections and the reduction of the backlog of work by the professional accountants within the Division of Administration will not be achieved.

In addition, it will work closely with division staff to develop solutions that meet prescribed needs and ensure successful implementation. As a result, this request seeks the transfer of existing IT FTEs from the Divisions of Agricultural Law Enforcement, Licensing, and Food, Nutrition and Wellness to staff the PPMO office within OATS.

These positions can be moved from their existing divisions with little impact and the move will not require any statutory changes or rule suspensions to achieve. In addition, moving unfunded salary rate and authority from the Division of Plant Industry will also have little effect. The Plant Industry Trust Fund currently has salary and benefit authority in excess of funding, which has resulted in reversions.

The current IT organizational structure and decision-making framework has resulted in a splintered environment with respect to the IT workforce and underlying support. The IT function is largely decentralized and concentrated among a handful of divisions that operate independently, based on individual needs and resources. Moving these positions to OATS will help the Department adopt more enterprise wide IT solutions and eliminate duplicative efforts currently being performed by division staff.

#### ADVERSE IMPACT IF NOT FUNDED:

The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services has largely operated as a collection of independent programs with unique and specific objectives. Each program or division is separately funded and conducts its activities with minimal consideration of other program areas. There is little if any coordinated effort for implementing new technologies or establishing standards for methodologies and solutions.

Without a team of qualified IT professionals experienced in project management and application development, capable of guiding the direction and progress of enterprise-level projects, it is unrealistic that a true cooperative effort can be engineered across the many programs of the organization. And without an authentic attempt to collaboratively achieve solutions for IT needs, such efforts are likely to fall short of expectations, and the department will almost certainly forego any possibility of cost savings through efficiencies over the use of current systems and processes.

These FTEs are needed to expand centralized revenue processing efforts, which will result in the enterprise solution of all revenues being processed and reconciled in one location. This issue also moves unfunded salary rate and associated authority from the Plant Industry Trust Fund within the Division of Plant Industry to the Division of Administration to provide sufficient rate and authority to fill the higher classified positions than those being eliminated in the Division of Fruit and Vegetables.

#### ISSUE SUMMARY:

The Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services collects over 200 different fees, licenses and permits. The department collected in excess of \$140 million in checks, coupons and remote payments in Fiscal Year 2012-13. The revenue is collected at different locations throughout the state. To improve our operational efficiencies, we plan to consolidate our collection sites. In addition, reconciliation of revenues to the number of licenses or permits issued is not being conducted at the division level. Professional accountants within the Division of Administration are responsible for recording journal transfers, credit card payments, ACH/wires, revenue corrections and accounts receivable and performing revenue analyses and reconciliations. Due to the amount of time these professional accountants currently spend on the manual check process, their other duties become back logged. The Division of Fruit and Vegetables can transfer three maintenance FTEs with little impact and the move will not require any statutory changes or rule suspensions to achieve. During the 2013 Legislative Session, the Department received approval to purchase a new building for the Division of Fruit and Vegetables. This new building will replace a much larger and much older building that is currently used to house staff from the Division of Fruit and Vegetables. As a result, the maintenance needs for the Division are expected to be greatly reduced.

The role of the Portfolio Project Management Office is central to the development, implementation, and modifications that accompany enterprise-level applications. The PPMO will be on the front-line of assessing and evaluating organizational business needs in order to identify the most effective IT solutions. It will also be instrumental in deciding which projects are green-lighted and which are deferred. In addition, it will work closely with division staff to develop solutions that meet prescribed needs and ensure successful implementation. As a result, this request seeks the transfer of existing IT FTEs from the Divisions of Agricultural Law Enforcement, Licensing, and Food, Nutrition and Wellness to staff the PPMO office within OATS.

These positions can be moved from their existing divisions with little impact and the move will not require any statutory changes or rule suspensions to achieve. In addition, moving unfunded salary rate and authority from the Division of Plant Industry will also have little effect. The Plant Industry Trust Fund currently has salary and benefit authority in excess of funding, which has resulted in reversions.

The current IT organizational structure and decision-making framework has resulted in a splintered environment with respect to the IT workforce and underlying support. The IT function is largely decentralized and concentrated among a handful of divisions that operate independently, based on individual needs and resources. Moving these positions to OATS will help the Department adopt more enterprise wide IT solutions and eliminate duplicative efforts currently being performed by division staff.

#### ADVERSE IMPACT IF NOT FUNDED:

The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services has largely operated as a collection of independent programs with unique and specific objectives. Each program or division is separately funded and conducts its activities with minimal consideration of other program areas. There is little if any coordinated effort for implementing new technologies or establishing standards for methodologies and solutions.

Without a team of qualified IT professionals experienced in project management and application development, capable of

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quiding the direction and progress of enterprise-level projects, it is unrealistic that a true cooperative effort can be engineered across the many programs of the organization. And without an authentic attempt to collaboratively achieve solutions for IT needs, such efforts are likely to fall short of expectations, and the department will almost certainly forego any possibility of cost savings through efficiencies over the use of current systems and processes.
